Currently we have low feedback on Rotarians attending the insurance and risk management seminar, details below.

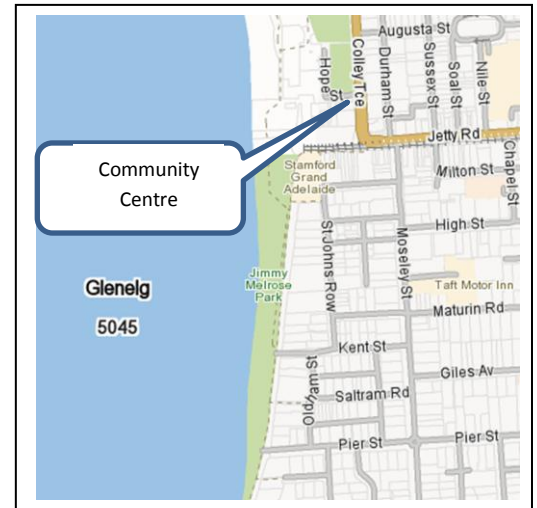
N.B. The invitation has been extended to all Chairs of Committees, the District Management Committee and Past District Governors.

Rotary Peace Communities International Conference

World President Sakuji Tanaka has chosen the theme "*Peace through service*" to set the direction and emphasis for Rotary projects during his term of 2012-2013.

What better way for Australian Rotarians to affirm this compelling theme than to conduct an **International Conference on Peace** and at the same time to celebrate the 10th anniversary of Rotary's own World Peace Fellowship program. It has been exactly one decade since Rotary established seven Rotary Centers for International Studies in peace and conflict resolution and launched leaders who promote Peace and the successful resolution of conflict in every continent around the world. In the future the World peace Fellowship Program will be seen as one of the major contributions that Rotary has ever made to world Peace.

You can register for the Rotary Peace Communities International Conference "**Peace in Action**" to be held in Wagga Wagga on 21 to 23 September through our website www.rotarypeace2012.org.au.

Wagga Wagga was the first Rotary Peace Community in the world with the number of communities now numbering over 50 and extending to all corners of the world. Delegates from every continent where there are Rotary Peace communities have already registered for the conference alongside many World Peace Fellows and representatives of the Centers in which they trained.

On his recent visit to Wagga Wagga, Kalyan Banerjee then World President of Rotary International, was so impressed with the Peace communities concept he encouraged as many Rotarians and other interested people as possible to attend this conference.

Thirteen internationally renowned speakers including Past Rotary International President Bill Boyd have been recruited to lead us in three days of exciting and informative conferencing.

Other highlights of the conference will be an Inter-faith peace ceremony at the Peace Monument, the Conference Anniversary Dinner and a Peace Conference Concert to be hosted by well-known country musician, Grant Luhrs.

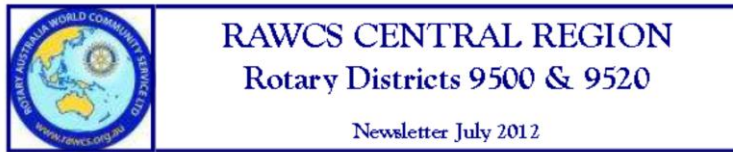

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

- Q. What does RAWCS Central Region do?**
- A.** We assist all Rotary Clubs in Districts 9500 & 9520 with the development and management of international community service projects.
- Q. Who's Behind it?**
- A.** RAWCS is an Australian-based program, run by Rotarians.
- Q. How many Regions are there?**
- A.** Australia is divided into five RAWCS Regions. The others are, Northern, Eastern, Southern & Western.
- Q. How can RAWCS help our club with working on an overseas project?**
- A.** There are many benefits for your club if it registers its overseas project with RAWCS, some of which are by:
- * attracting additional volunteers and donations;
 - * preventing duplication of materials and donations to the same cause;
 - * assisting with verifying that the project will be sustainable and produce the expected benefits;
 - * ensuring that team members are registered with the various authorities and insurance requirements have been completed; and
 - * offering tax deductibility for those who want it.

THE FOUR KEY RAWCS PROGRAMS ARE:

- ROTARIANS AGAINST MALARIA
- SAFE SANITATION & WATER SAVES LIVES
- DONATIONS IN KIND
- PROJECT VOLUNTEERS



Examples of Projects and Programs undertaken through RAWCS:

- provision of medical, dental and general health facilities across second and third world countries
- supply of clean water to villages
- street children helped into homes and given education
- thousands protected against malaria
- shelter provided for those left homeless after natural disasters
- medical equipment transported into remote regions
- microfinance organised for poverty-stricken communities
- care homes for the elderly
- literacy programs taught in villages
- AIDS education programs
- vocational education training programs
- staff accommodation constructed to bring volunteers and professionals into remote regions needing assistance
