Australian Foundation for Fostering Learning in the Philippines

Are you looking for a good speaker and a good cause?

The Australian Foundation for Fostering Learning in the Philippines (AFFLIP), is a not for profit Foundation, based in South Australia, comprising people with a deep interest in education who want to make a contribution to the educational development of young people living in some of the poorest areas of the Philippines. AFFLIP's focus is on learning, and so its various programs involve fundraising to provide physical facilities and learning resources for schools, linking with other agencies to promote the health and nutrition of students, and supporting professional development for teachers.

In the next few years AFFLIP is working with 15 elementary schools in the Talomo District of the Department of Education of the Philippines which houses some of the most disadvantaged schools in Davao City, the largest city on the island of Mindanao in the southern Philippines. Each year AFFLIP designs a program, in collaboration with the schools and the Education Department in Davao City, which seeks to meet needs identified by the school communities, in ways consistent with the available resources. In addition, Talomo District schools are 'twinned' with schools in South Australia, and this facilitates such activities as exchange programs and collaborative learning projects focusing on issues which impact on the lives of people living in both countries.
