Semi-Annual Report

This is a reminder to all Rotary clubs that the July 2012 membership portion of the Semi-annual Report (SAR) is due no later than **30 September**. Rotary International bases Rotary club membership starting figures on July SAR data, so it's essential that we receive membership details by the end of September. If your club has not received the July 2012 SAR, you can print a duplicate copy from your **Member Access** account or request one at <u>data@rotary.org</u>.

To ensure that your club has submitted complete SAR information, please note the following:

- If your club submitted only SAR payment, you still must submit the complete report with your membership count and details.
- If you updated your club membership via **Member Access** or by using local database/club software that participates in OneRotary data integration project: remember to email data@rotary.org certifying your club's membership count for July 2012 SAR period. In your email, please state number of members and subscribers to **The Rotarian** (in English) or **Revista Rotaria** (in Spanish), and include "July 2012 SAR of Rotary Club of [your club name and number]" in the subject line.

If your club already submitted the July 2012 SAR, please disregard this notice.

District Governors and Assistant Governors can verify submission of the membership portion of July 2012 SAR in **Member Access** (after signing in, click View Current Semi-annual Reports (SARs), then click 5-Year Membership History report).

Please note: it is extremely important for clubs to report officers and update their email addresses.

A large attendance is expected and Rotarians are urged to book early to attend this event.



The Otaga Youth Adventure Trust/ The Rotary Club of Milton Tramping Trust

The volunteers of The Otago Youth Adventure Trust/Rotary Club of Milton Tramping Club Inc. have now completed 26 successful seasons of organising the trips, with some 16,000 people, mostly Kiwis and Aussies, having participated (many on several trips over the years). We operate as a Tramping Club on public lands and, as such, are required (by law) to run the trips on a "cost recovery" basis only. Participants are predominately middle aged, and have to become members of our Tramping Club (\$50) in the year of their trips, and we do suggest an <u>optional</u> donation, to enable us to return some funds to the two Charitable Trusts that are the parent bodies of our Club. All the trips are lead and organised by unpaid volunteers, who put thousands of voluntary hours into this ongoing project to ensure we are able to run the trips at a moderate cost. We have received much National acclaim for our project.



So let's use it. The billboard is kindly being housed by Paradise Motors, 738, Lower North East Road, Paradise, 5075 Bookings can be made by contacting Jeff Neale jeff.neale@paradisemotors.com.au or (08 83369968) if he isn't there, leave a message.

The Mobile Billboard is a braked trailer with a tandem axle and mass weight of 1,990 kgs.

Before you drive off with this trailer in tow, you need to make sure its weight is within your vehicle's braked towing capacity.

Braked Towing capacity is specified by the vehicle manufacturer and can usually be found in the owner's manual and is the maximum allowable weight that a vehicle can tow. A guide to safety and rules can be found here;

Drivers with towing experience are recommended and care of the asset must be ensured at all times.

There is a \$500 excess on Insurance which covers minor damage to the trailer, skins and electrical damage. A safety check list will be issued when bookings are made.

A 5 pin electrical connection plug is essential (not a 7 point) and the locking key must be used when the trailer is detached from the towing vehicle.
