A 5 pin electrical connection plug is essential (not a 7 point) and the locking key must be used when the trailer is detached from the towing vehicle. There is a \$500 excess on Insurance which covers minor damage to the trailer, skins and electrical damage. A safety check list will be issued when bookings are made.
