- We at Central Adelaide Palliative Care Service are looking to recruit more volunteers for patient support, particularly from the central and eastern side of Adelaide. Our service has recently changed from Western Adelaide Palliative Care (where we covered patients from The Queen Elizabeth Hospital in the western suburbs of Adelaide) to Central Adelaide Palliative Care Service which now incorporates patients from the Royal Adelaide Hospital and covers Adelaide and surrounding close-by suburbs in the North & South as well as the Eastern Suburbs. Our volunteering service covers 3 key areas

- Home visits volunteers provide companionship, respite and/or transport to patients in their homes
- Ward based volunteers provide companionship, listening, activity sharing, foot/hand massage and family support to patients on our hospital ward
- Bereavement specialist volunteers provide bereavement support and companionship individually or in a group setting

We would appreciate an opportunity to further explain these services to your members.


