In preparation for the Jan 2013 SAR, it is highly recommended that club officers do the following:

- First of all, in case your club has not already done so, please take this opportunity to join the multitude of
  Rotary Clubs worldwide that have chosen to receive their SAR packet by email (E-SAR) and have opted out of
  receiving it by post (paper SAR). It's easy; your club's secretary, president, or executive secretary/director
  should login to Member Access and select the check box under "Update Club Data, Semiannual Report
  Preference." Be sure to save your update.
- 2. Complete all membership updates in <u>Member Access</u> no later than 01 December, 2012 for the January 2013 SAR, and make sure that all officers have a current e-mail address on file. [Clubs in the <u>OneRotary database integration</u>: only update your *local* system, but please complete by 25 November]
- 3. Finally, to help ensure that SAR e-mail from Rotary is not rejected or filtered as spam, add rotary\_international\_sar@microdg.com as an approved sender to your e-mail account.





# ROMAC Concert - Roger Woodward - Sunday 25<sup>th</sup> November 2012 - For flyer see Herald No 16





Five year old Rex Khumo came to Adelaide from the Highlands of Papua New Guinea for Cranio Facial treatment at the Australian Cranio Facial Unit, headed by Professor David David. The Cranio Facial Unit is part of the Women's and Children's Hospital situated in North Adelaide.

Roger Woodward AC, OM (Pol), OBE, one of Australia's one hundred National Treasures returns to Adelaide, to perform in aid of ROMAC (Rotary Oceania Medical Aid for Children). This pianist and, presently, Professor at San Francisco State University has now been at the forefront of national and international music making for more than half a century. He celebrates his 70th birthday in December this year. His concert appearances and lifelong recording activities have garnered exceptional reviews continuing to confirm his place as belonging to the highest echelon of living pianists.

He will present a largely Chopin performance with Christ Church Camerata who are based in Newcastle.

All proceeds of the concert will be applied to ROMAC, a project of Rotary Districts in Australia and New Zealand. ROMAC assists "forgotten" children from Oceanic countries who might have congenital deformities, burns injuries, malformations or heart problems and brings them to Australia and NZ hospitals for life saving and/or dignity-restoring surgery.



Rex was operated on by Dr. Mark Moore who completely restructured his face. Rex and his mother remained in Adelaide for six weeks before returning home where Rex will lead a normal life after being ostracized by his peers.




