



- Complete all membership updates in <u>Member Access</u> no later than 01 December, 2012 for the January 2013 SAR, and make sure that all officers have a current e-mail address on file. [Clubs in the <u>OneRotary</u> <u>database integration</u>: only update your *local* system, but please complete by 25 November]
- 3. Finally, to help ensure that SAR e-mail from Rotary is not rejected or filtered as spam, add rotary international sar@microdg.com as an approved sender to your e-mail account.


