Recently, our first RLI for the year was held at Flinders University. This session had 14 participants, all eager to learn more about Rotary, and how they can best contribute to our purpose.

DG Sam opened the weekend, outlining the role of RLI in the District Training program, and the important place it has in developing leaders within clubs, then handing over to facilitators PDG Euan Miller and Damian Leach.

Over the course of the weekend, the fourteen participants learnt more about the structure of Rotary, developing and implementing projects (including Foundation projects), public image, the role of vocational service and the key part membership development has in our organisation. As well as partake in some pretty delicious food in break times, and have the opportunity to review support materials available.

What did the participants say?


The training provides a good foundation about the workings of Rotary and provides some skills in dealing with challenges you may encounter, and learnings to achieve positive outcomes from those challenges

Emorgo Kidney Transplant House

South Australia has a wonderful success record for kidney transplants. More kidney transplants are performed at the RAH per head of population than in any other state in the nation. SA also provides kidney transplants for the Northern Territory. To further support this program, Kidney Health Australia (KHA) which is the peak body in the country for those suffering from kidney disease, is currently building Emorgo



Transplant House located close to the new RAH.

Receiving a new kidney involves a six day hospital stay followed by daily visits early in the morning for the next 14 days to check medications and to monitor progress. For patients living outside Adelaide this means staying in hotels/motels for three weeks, an expense many cannot afford. Emorgo Transplant House will provide a self catering facility for patients and their carers during this crucial time of early recovery but at minimal cost.

KHA, through its own fund-raising efforts, is paying for the erection of Emorgo Transplant House, a wonderful asset for South Australia. However, to furnish this unit will require an additional outlay of around **\$25,000**. KHA is asking the people in South Australia to please assist.

As a Rotarian, and a member of KHA's South Australian Consumer Committee, I invite Rotary clubs to consider financially supporting this initiative.
